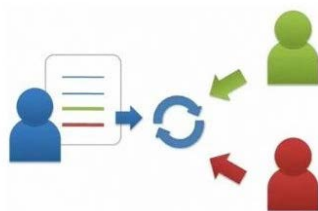
Knowledge brokerage

Collaborative writing



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Both the Short Food Supply Chain (SFSC) CoP and the Revaluing Public Procurement (RPP) CoP are experimenting with writing a collaborative document. The SFSC document includes sections on characteristics of short chains, sustainability and health aspects, impacts on regulations, and organisational patterns suitable for short food supply chains. The RPP document (which is called the "Tirrenia Charter") focuses on the process of change in public food procurement. Why is change needed? What is already happening and how can we support this change?

Story of value creation from Tukums, Latvia

“Recently we organised Skype meetings among three urban food strategies (UFS) CoP members. Apart from gaining information on the evolution of UFS in Malmo and Vienna, I got a better idea about how to structure the UFS in Tukums. For example – the strong emphasis on school catering and children education in Malmo seemed a relevant activity that could be included in Tukums food strategy. In addition, I used some methods learnt during the project, for example – speed dating, scenario building in my classes and seminars with students. Now I practice Skype meetings in communication with PhD students. Knowing these tools, at least partly, I feel more empowered and more confident to jump in with these quite simple communication technologies.” - *Talis Tisenkopfs*
